Early postsecondary opportunities (EPSOs) include a course and/or exam that gives students a chance to obtain postsecondary credit while still in high school.

Typical Cost of College Courses

College Courses are usually 3 credit hours \$370 per credit hours \$370 x 3 =\$1,110





DE College Courses are usually 3 credit hours Roughly \$167 per credit hour \$167 x 3 = \$500

Important Note*

Most of HHS's partnering institutions honor what is called the "First Four". This refers to the first four courses of the dual enrollment grant. If a student uses their DE grant 1 and DE grant 2 with the same institution, that institution will provide a scholarship for any remaining balance that the student may have for courses three and four.

Dual Enrollment Grant

To **qualify** for the TN **Dual Enrollment Grant**, a student must be a junior or senior in high school, lived in Tennessee for one year prior to **applying** for the **grant**, and maintained at least a 2.75 GPA in all previous **dual Enrollment** coursework.
